






Downtown Austin, 2010-2015 of Tex Hd Rd Mar 1st St Cosa Fiesta Gardens

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


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Street Width and Crash Severity




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When comparing the highest crash Census Tracts versus the lowest crash Census Tracts, the highest crash Tracts had:

- 20% lower car ownership
- 4X transit mode share
- Half of median household income
- 50% higher Hispanic/Latino population (%)
- Nearly 3X Black population (%)
- Nearly 3X as many people speak English "less than very well"



High Crash Census Tracts Austin, 2010-2015

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Homelessness

- Pedestrian crashes account for 14% of deaths among individuals experiencing homelessness in Travis County
- Pedestrian crashes account for only 0.1% of deaths for all of Travis County residents








Deploy Vision Zero Street Teams to conduct targeted outreach and educational campaigns promoting pedestrian safety






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Evaluation Actions

Establish a robust pedestrian counting program to gain a better understanding of walking demand in Austin and to help prioritize pedestrian improvements with limited resources.






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

Include pedestrian safety and comfort as principal considerations in all City policies governing street and site design






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
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Enforcement Actions
