

Did you know? The crash rate for someone driving 20 to 25 mph over the posted speed limit is **37% HIGHER** than someone driving the posted speed limit. Even if you beat the statistic, you'll be disqualified from driving a CMV for at least 60 days if you're caught driving that fast over the speed limit.

Drive fast, finish last. Driving 15 to 20 mph over the posted speed limit not only **increases** your risk of crashing but can cause you to lose your CDL for at least 60 days. #StayOnTheRoad

Driving more than 25 mph over the posted speed limit is more consequential than you may think.

- The rate of harsh braking events is over 4.5 times the rate for segments with no speed differential. --> Braking can cause your wheels to lock up resulting in skidding.
- Even if you don't have to brake harshly, if you're caught driving that fast, you'll be disqualified from driving a CMV for at least 60 days.

Accelerating slowly can be the difference between arriving to your destination or not arriving at all. Did you know that **frequent harsh accelerating** can DOUBLE your chances of getting in a crash?

Don't be a danger and #StayOnTheRoad.



Drive fast, finish last. Did you know that when going 25 mph over the posted speed limit, CMV operators were **14 times MORE likely** to receive a DPS citation?

This also means you'll be disqualified from driving a CMV for at least 60 days.

When you go 20 mph over the speed limit and crash, someone, whether it's the driver, passengers, pedestrians or other occupants, is 300% more likely to die or be seriously injured. And even if you don't crash, you're risking a speeding citation which would disqualify you from driving a CMV for a least 60 days.

If you get into a crash while driving 15 to 20 mph over the posted speed limit, the **chances of death or serious injury increases by 95%**. And if you're caught driving that fast, your chances of being disqualified from driving a CMV is 100%.
